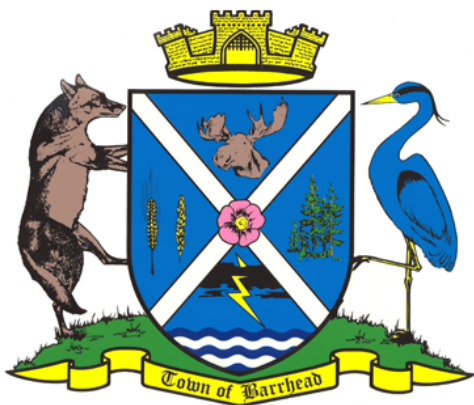

GENERAL REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Registration for Focus on 4-H is on-line. Please go to www.4habregistration.ca to register. You will need your username and password. If you do not have your username, or do not receive 4-H email, please contact the Northwest Region Area Coordinator, Pam Gitzel, pam.gitzel@4hab.com for this information.

Before registering for any program through the 4-H on-line registration system, you will be required to complete the digital forms. These forms will be attached to your profile and can simply be updated when necessary and/or each year. **Please be aware that even though the health record asks for food allergies, we are not able to accommodate all dietary requirements.** Please see pg 9 for more details.

ENTRY DEADLINE:

MAY 15, 2022 Entry deadline is applicable to all projects and events, and is firm. **NO late entries** will be accepted.

PAYMENT

You may pay for your Focus on 4-H registration individually, or by club. At the end of your registration you will see a button "Proceed to Payment". You can choose to pay by cheque (individually or as a club), or via e-transfer. If paying by cheque, please make it payable to Northwest 4-H Regional Council and send it to Box 569 Thorsby AB T0C 2P0. If paying via e-transfer, please email it to northwest4htreasurer@gmail.com. Be sure to include a message that indicates you are making a payment for Focus on 4-H, who you are paying for, and which club you are from.

For confirmation that information is correct, a summary of your registration will be sent to you and your club contact.

There will be some activities organized specifically for Cleaver Kids project members – "Eager Beavers". Cleaver Kid members, and other underage youth, are also welcome to participate in the drop-in crafts, to cheer on other club members, and to watch and learn if they do not wish to register in the Eager Beavers activities.

****Note: If your club wishes to enter the lip-sync contest, please have members include this in their registration.***

ON-LINE REGISTRATION INSTRUCTION DETAILS

- Go to www.4habregistration.ca
- Sign in with the appropriate username and password. Each member/ leader/ volunteer has their own log-in information. Members must register individually. Leaders and registered volunteers can register with their own username and password, or as part of their child's registration.
- Click on "Program Registration" in the top right corner of the page. (If you have not already filled in the program agreement, health record, and medication permission forms, you will be required to do so before being able to access the Focus on 4-H registration.)
- Find and click on "Focus on 4-H" in the member and/or adult program list.
- Read the basic information and then click on "Register Now" in the top right.

- There is NO base registration fee.
- Fees are charged pending your Registration Choices - Shows, Workshops, Meals, etc. These fees allow them to enter in all applicable activities and receive meals selected: Friday (Breakfast &/or Supper), Saturday (Breakfast &/or Supper), and Sunday(Breakfast). Extra meal passes may be purchased when registering, for additional family members and friends.

- Activity/Project Entry:
 - **Cleaver Kids** – Please select "Eager Beaver". This will register you for each of the events planned specifically for your age group. **Do not** select any of the other project specific activities.
 - **Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Members** - As you work your way down the page, select each activity or project event you wish to enter. A drop down box will open for each part of the show that requires more information.
 - **Adults** – If you are a registered leader or volunteer, and you wish to register for any of the workshops, please register through your own log-in. If you do not care to register for any specific activities, you are free to add meal package(s) and/or t-shirts to your child's registration.
 - If you are not a registered volunteer or leader, and you wish to participate in a specific activity, please add this to the notes section at the bottom of your child's registration. Pam will contact you to confirm.

- Focus on 4-H follows the 4-H Code of Conduct which you must agree to before completing your registration. If you have any questions, please contact the regional 4-H office.

- When you have completed your registration, "Proceed to Summary". The main categories of your registration, along with their costs, will show on this screen. If you wish to make changes, you can simply go back with your browser.
- If everything on the summary looks correct, "Proceed to Payment". Details of providing payment will be shown.

- Once received your registration is reviewed and a summary sent to you and your club contact for confirmation of eligibility and entries.
 - If there are any corrections, please provide them to the office as soon as possible. Each committee needs time to create their class groupings and programs

GUIDELINES & GENERAL INFORMATION

AGE CATEGORIES FOR PARTICIPANTS

Age will be calculated as of **January 1, 2022**. Age categories apply to all shows.

Junior: 9 to 11 years Intermediate: 12 to 14 years Senior: 15 to 20 years
Clever Kids: 6 to 8 years ("Eager Beavers" program only)

ARRIVAL / DEPARTURE – Barrhead Ag Grounds

► **Animals admitted:**

- Thursday BEEF 6:00 pm - 10:00 pm.
- Friday EQUINE & CANINE 4:00 pm - 8:30 pm.
- Saturday EQUINE & CANINE 7:00 am - 8:00 am.

► **Animals released:**

- Beef must remain on the grounds until 9:00 pm Friday.
- All animals will be released no later than 6:00 pm on Sunday.

► **Registration:** All **families, and each club's contact**, are asked to check in at the **Registration Desk** upon arrival.

- Collect your information packages. (family contact)
- Hand in your silent auction item(s) – minimum (combined) value of \$50 per club. (club contact)

STABLING

- Horses may be stalled in trailers, or bring your own panels. There will be no on-site stalling available.
- Beef will be tied in the Ag Barn area during the day, and rodeo grounds pens overnight.
- Unloading of livestock permitted only at designated locations. A map will be provided.

FEED AND BEDDING

Bring your own feed and bedding – straw or shavings – for all livestock. No supply is available on site. No bedding allowed in the Ag Barn.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Accommodations while attending Focus on 4-H are the responsibility of the participants.

On-Site overnight sites are available on the grounds for \$10.00 per site for the weekend. This fee applies to all units used for accommodation and parked in the overnight areas. This charge is due May 15th with registration fees. No hook-ups available. 4-H members are expected to keep their overnight areas clean.

- *Members and families please note: You are considered to be on a 4-H program site, and 4-H rules and policies will apply. This means that alcohol and tobacco use are not permitted on the program site. See the Code of Conduct for details.*

A map of the camping area will be available at the Show Office, and at the entry to the camping area. Quiet times in the camping area are 11:00 pm – 7:00 am. **(No generators during this time please!)**

*If you wish to have guests camp with your club, please ensure that you have booked enough sites to include them. Likewise, if you have a trailer and several tents, please book more than one site to ensure enough room, without encroaching on the space allotted to the next club. Sites are sized at 20' x 40'.

Off-Site / Hotel Accommodations

If you wish to stay in a **hotel**, the **Barrhead Inn & Suites** and the **Barrhead Neighbourhood Inn** are both within a block of the Ag Grounds. Barrhead Neighbourhood Inn has a restaurant as well.

LIABILITY

All exhibits shall be under the control and direction of Focus on 4-H and facilities owners and operators, but solely at the risk of the exhibitor. Focus on 4-H will not be responsible for damage, injury, loss or theft. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage done to, occasioned by or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by the exhibitor and for its description as given in the catalogue, and shall indemnify Focus on 4-H and facility owners and community boards against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted, nor suit instituted or maintained, against facility owners and operating boards, officers or agents, by or on behalf of any visitor, or any person, firm or corporation or their agents, representatives or employees, having license or privilege to exhibit in the area or occupying any space thereon. Facility owner and operators: Barrhead Agricultural Society and Town of Barrhead.

FACILITY

Focus on 4-H is being held in the community of Barrhead. The community is very supportive of local clubs. Please be friendly and open in sharing information about 4-H and what we are doing with any of the public who may stop in to watch.

We will have access to change rooms in the Agrena for **showers**, although in limited numbers. There are indoor washrooms in all of the buildings, and we will have porta-potties as usual.

Dogs, other than service dogs, **are not allowed in the buildings**. Those dogs registered in the Canine Show will be allowed in the show area only.

*We understand that your dog is not just your pet, but part of your family, SO, if you must bring your dog with you to Focus on 4-H, **ALL DOGS ARE required to be on a leash at all times**, including in the campground area. **Dogs should not 'watch' the show with you** as they may be a distraction for the other Show animals. **Cleaning up after your dog** isn't just the right thing to do, it's the law. Barking is natural for dogs when they are bored, lonely or want to alert their owners of something. However, **excessive barking** can disturb and upset your neighbours. **Dogs seen as being aggressive or unmanageable will not be tolerated and asked to leave the grounds without warning.***

The fine for violating any of these rules is \$100.

VOLUNTEERS

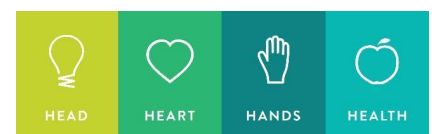

In addition to the executive and committee chairs, numerous other people volunteer throughout the year and at Focus on 4-H for the project show committees, special events and overall program.

Focus on 4-H is a Northwest 4-H Regional program for **ALL 4-H members**. We **invite** 4-H members from other 4-H Regions to register and participate, if room allows. Committees may contact non-Northwest 4-H members to indicate that their show programs are full. If this is the case, a full refund will be issued.

ADULT PARTICIPATION

The caring and preparation of the project animals, showing of animals, caring for stalls, etc. at the Focus on 4-H shows are the responsibility of the 4-H members, not the adults. No adult participation in project related work will be tolerated in any of the shows at this event. 4-H members needing assistance can ask any other registered 4-H member. Designated 4-H Leaders are assigned to attend to the safe care of 4-H members during the shows. There are workshops throughout the weekend that adults are welcome to participate in.

Rules and Guidelines:

Clubs are reminded this is a Lip Sync Contest. Members must be lip syncing, not just dancing to the music.

- ★ One entry per club.
- ★ Lip Sync can be a maximum of four (4) minutes in length.
- ★ Duplication of songs will be allowed but both clubs will be notified in case one wants to change.
- ★ Songs must be in '4-H spirit' (that means no questionable lyrics/actions). All songs submitted are assumed to be screened by leaders.

- ★ Failure to follow these guidelines will result in disqualification.

- ★ Crowd reaction 20%



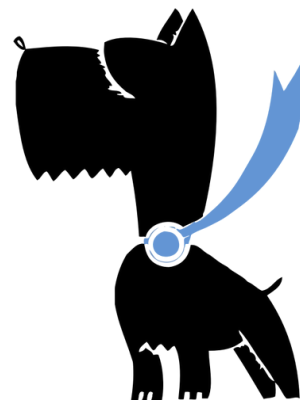

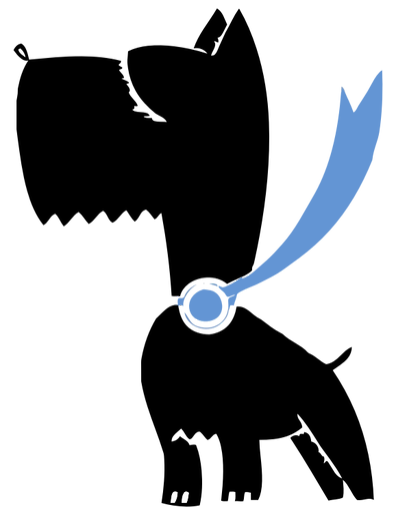

CANINE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS & RULES

1. **Acceptable collars are snap or buckle.**
2. Dogs must have up to date canine vaccinations.
3. Members are responsible for supplying kennels for their dogs.
4. Unsupervised dogs must be kenneled. No dogs may be tied.
5. **Dogs must be under control at all times (leashed, under command and in control)** or they will be asked to leave the facility as per show committee.
6. No dogs allowed in concession or meal areas.
7. **Absolutely no washing of dogs in public bathrooms.**
8. Pick up fecal matter.
9. Members wear Focus ID when with their dogs.
10. Adults are discouraged from handling dogs. Exceptions: safety issue or if member is with other project.
11. Please report with *your number card* before each class in which you are registered to confirm your entry.
12. **Absolutely no unsupervised use of rally equipment or agility equipment.**
13. Classes and times may change based on entries in each event.
14. A 4-H member/dog handler can enter only one dog per class.
15. A 4-H member/dog handler may show a maximum of two dogs per show.

REGIONAL BEEF SHOW GENERAL RULES

All of the Northwest Regional Beef Regulations will be followed and in effect. Rules are available from the 4-H office.

YOUR ENTRY FEE MUST ACCOMPANY YOUR SHOW ENTRY

1. Members are encouraged to be a part of all Focus activities even though the beef show concludes on Friday.
2. **All 4-H members and clubs** are welcome to participate. Cattle need to be on site by 9:30 Thursday evening and cattle are to remain on the grounds until **9:00 pm on Friday, July 8.**
3. Stalling provided in outdoor rodeo pens for all beef animals.
4. All animals **MUST** have a halter and a neck rope. Leaders/Parent Volunteers are required to check for neck ropes at night. Should livestock not have a neck rope, one will be provided, and the club will be billed for the cost. (\$25) **All cattle, including calves, require neck ropes!**
5. All 4-H members are encouraged to bring grooming chutes, clippers, blowers and generators. An area will be designated for grooming chutes. There will be limited access to power.
6. All members entered in the Northwest Regional Show must be members in good standing with their club and have fulfilled all project requirements.
7. All projects are judged equally. Club and district placing have no influence at this show.
8. Unruly animals will be stalled in a safe area. The member will be given a second chance to show they can control the animal. If at this time the animal is deemed to be dangerous, the member will be asked to take it from show premises. The final decision will be left to the Northwest Regional Beef Show committee.
9. **Showmanship:** Open to all 4-H members. Members must pre-register by entry deadline. Members are responsible for finding an animal to show (it may be one of their projects) and providing show equipment.
Grooming **will not** be taken into consideration of your placing.
10. Showmanship classes are based on member's age as of January 1st of current year. All members must be in the staging area prior to their class and prepared to show. If you miss your class, you forfeit the opportunity to show in the class. **REMINDER: Proper and polite show etiquette must be exhibited at all times.**
11. **NO PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT WILL BE TOLERATED**, except when member and/or animal safety is an issue. FOCUS Barn Boss will give one verbal warning then member will be **disqualified from competition.**
12. All feed and tack must be stored in designated areas, as assigned by Show Committee.
Members to provide straw or shavings for outside stalls and are responsible for cleanup. No bedding or feed allowed in the Ag Barn.
13. Stalls, aisles, wash rack and common areas must be always kept neat and clean. All stalling areas to be cleaned of straw and taken to designated area before leaving Ag Grounds.
14. **Animals will not be released until 7:00 pm on Friday, if members are a part of another show event.** Members must help with clean up before being released. All bedding and manure to be removed, show ring dismantled and panels piled, garbage cleaned up. Approval from show committee must be received before leaving.
15. *Grievance Procedure:* Should there be a grievance, it must be submitted in writing, with \$25.00 to the show office. The Northwest Show Committee will then meet to review the grievance. Should the grievance be upheld, the money will be refunded to the complainant.

NOTE: ALL CLUBS/MEMBERS participating in the beef show must:

1. **Have a PARENT/LEADER in attendance during the Beef Show,**
2. **PARENT/LEADER and/or MEMBERS to be responsible for show ring and marshalling area cleanliness during the show**

TEAM GROOMING RULES

Team Grooming will consist of two (2) or three (3) members; the members will be entered in the class according to age of the oldest competitor. Individuals entering will be assigned a partner and/or a team. NOTE: More detailed rules to be forwarded to members prior to FOCUS.

AWARDS

Awards will be presented to Grand and Reserve Champion in Confirmation Classes. Grand and Reserve Champion in Supreme Female Classes. 1st & 2nd in Jr., Sr. & Int. REGIONAL HORSE SHOW GENERAL INFO

The Northwest 4-H Regional Horse Show is planned under the direction of the Northwest 4-H Horse Committee. It includes representatives from all participating horse project clubs.

1. Stabling

There will be no stabling available for horses. Horses may be stalled in trailers or bring your own panels. Camping space is limited so please put panels against trailers or horses' side by side to use as little space as is safe. No electric fence pens. Clubs are responsible for keeping their **camping areas** clean. Bring shovels, manure tubs, wheelbarrows. Follow signs posted.

2. Show and Warm Up

Warm up area will be clearly marked, times and arena rules will be posted. Arenas will be open for warm-up before and after show each day. **Leaders are responsible for supervision of their club's members.** If any members are in the rings unsupervised or not following the rules they will be asked to leave. While warming up riders must be fully tacked up with a saddle and a bridle, helmet, and boots with a heel (no shorts or tank tops while mounted). No parents or non-members may ride. If a parent or non-member is on a horse it is grounds for dismissal of member, who is registered with the horse, from the show grounds, no refunds will be given. **No bareback or doubling allowed ON THE SHOW GROUNDS.** Please use your discretion on riding to and from the show rings at a WALK only. Those seen trotting or loping outside the arena's rings will be asked to dismount and walk their horses. Please DO NOT ride your horse in any inappropriate area (i.e. ball diamonds, sidewalks, roads, near tents, etc.).

3. Jumps (Poles and Cavaletti)

For the hunter over fence classes the poles used will be 10 to 12 feet long. The poles and cavalettis class is to a maximum of 18" and available to any level. NO cross entry will be allowed with the Hunter Over Fences classes. Poles and Cavalettis is a walk/trot class only, all levels will be allowed two strides of cantering before and after the cavaletti and must bring their horses back to a trot. If higher Hunter Over Fences classes are of interest, we are willing to look at more classes.

4. Gymkhana

Level 1 gymkhana is trotting only! Level 2-7 gymkhana will be loping.

5. Games

There will be an adult helper with all games to hold horses and to help members if needed. Safety is very important in all aspects of riding. Members are encouraged to complete the games on horseback, but if the need arises, the member may dismount, while a handler holds their horse to complete the game, remounting to cross the finish line.

6. Show Numbers

Show numbers will reflect a member's riding level. Leaders are responsible to ensure correct levels prior to submitting the entry forms. The level indicated on the entry form will be the level in which the member shows. Numbers must be worn on your back or clearly visible on **both** sides of your saddle pad at all times when showing.

7. Gate Operators and Safety Watchers – Club Work Assignments

With safety of our 4-H members in mind during Focus on 4-H every 4-H club participating in the Regional Horse Show will be responsible for providing horse familiar adult volunteers to supervise an arena for an assignment time. Communication and cooperation will go a long way towards making participation at Focus on 4-H a positive experience for all involved. Assigned shifts will be two hours in length. If the time assigned doesn't work for your club, switch with another club but notify the horse show committee. A description of the

volunteer jobs follows. A cell # and contact name will be provided and on all posted schedules so volunteers can get a hold of the next club responsible for gate duty if the posted club does not show up.

HITCHING RINGS: Assure there is no warming up, riding around etc. taking place in the hitching ring. Assure only members on deck are those about to compete in the next class. Offer assistance should any problems arise in the hitching ring.

ENTRY GATES: Check off entrants for each class as they enter the hitching ring. Call or ask someone to locate any entrants who have not arrived in the hitching area shortly before start of class. Allow entry of each class into the ring, when directed.

8. Helmets

As per the Northwest Regional rule voted on November 2010 all riders must at all times wear an approved helmet when mounted. Think safety first and remember: A good feeling after the ride is better than winning a prize!

9. Camping/Trailers

Allowing enough space for camping and horses in paneled enclosures on site can be a challenge. We will try to assign camping based on club members registered. We would like everyone to keep a reasonable safe distance between clubs and families.

10. Musical Ride

Please bring music on your phone so we can just plug in or blue tooth from.
