FEED RECORD EXPLANATION

Important Feed Terms

- Nutrients - Needed for maintenance, growth, production and reproduction. Animals require water, protein, carbohydrates (energy), vitamins, and minerals.
- Balance Ration - A feed mixture that supplies an animal's entire daily nutritional needs.
- Concentrate - High energy feed.
- Supplements - A combination of nutrients added to feed to balance a ration.
- Feed additives - Other ingredients added to a ration to improve feed efficiency and weight gain.
